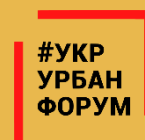


Ukrainian Urban Forum 2023: Common Home

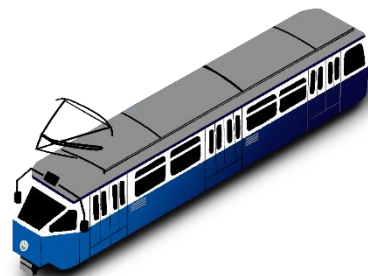

Ukrainian Urban Forum: Common Home — the fifth annual event about just development of our cities. This summer forum is taking place in unprecedented and tragic conditions.

The Russian war destroyed hundreds of thousands of dwellings, depriving millions of people of homes and the feeling of safety. Therefore, during the forum, we will discuss access to adequate housing, which is an inalienable human right. We will discuss the housing question from different perspectives and highlight its spatial and social aspects. During the two days, we will emphasise the role of housing in the recovery process and its connection with other urban development spheres.

Common Home — is an attempt to create a place for networking, experience and knowledge exchange, as well as a place for support and solidarity. Cities are our common home, and their recovery will not be possible without victory and liberation of all occupied territories, and we are grateful to the Armed Forces of Ukraine for being able to organise a forum this year.
